Broadcast Schedule

Sportsnet has announced its 2015-16 CHL broadcast schedule, featuring more than 50 regular season games and the return of **Friday Night Hockey**. Coverage kicks off Monday, Nov. 9 with the first game of the **2015 CHL Canada Russia Series** as Team Russia takes on Team WHL at **10 p.m. ET / 7 p.m. ET** on **Sportsnet East, Ontario, West and Pacific** and the Sportsnet app. (See full broadcast schedule below).

Sportsnet's 2015-16 CHL broadcast schedule also includes **Friday Night Hockey**, featuring a game every Friday night during the regular season. **Friday Night Hockey** hits the ice for the first time this season on **Friday, Nov. 13** as Vancouver hosts Kamloops at **10:30 p.m. ET / 7:30 p.m. PT** on **Sportsnet East, Ontario, West and Pacific**.
